
# Festival de Reyes! Three Kings Festival and Dinner! Sunday, January 5 at 5:00 in the afternoon at Oak Grove!

## **Collaboration Update** —

Our Collaboration of Richfield ELCA Churches (House of Prayer, Oak Grove, and Woodlake) is excited to announce three new joint initiatives for and with the community of Richfield! Below is a brief summary of the process we worked through in 2019 and the ideas we are ready to act on.

In spring, leaders from all three churches agreed to hire a community organizer as a consultant to lead us on a path to discern the ways our congregations could collectively make an impact outside our walls. Laura (our consultant) first met with several leaders from each congregation to hear what needs & opportunities we are already aware of and excited about. Then they and additional volunteers canvassed neighbors around our church buildings to get direct community input. Small groups also met with several key community leaders like the mayor, school principals, Rec Department staff, and more. Collectively, we learned that our passions and the community's needs overlapped strongly around the topics of youth programming, helping seniors stay in their homes, and building relationships between immediate neighbors. In early December, we agreed to explore the following initiatives:

- Middle School Partnership Project: Hosting additional afterschool activities and small groups at Woodlake Lutheran for the middle schoolers across the street. This would complement the existing afterschool programs and increase their capacity.
- **Home Helpers:** Building a network of volunteers from our congregations to assist senior neighbors or those with disabilities with basic home maintenance: mowing, shoveling, raking, minor repairs, etc.

## *Note of Thanks...*

Thank you Oak Grove!

Since November last year, we have collected over 1,000 box tops to send to the Navajo Lutheran Mission in Arizona. As some of you have noticed, there are some changes coming for the Box Tops for Education program.

What is changing, you may ask? They are switching out the physical box tops for a more digital process. This will be happening over the next few years. This digital process works through a new cell phone app, called Box Tops for Education, which is used to take photos of your receipts. The app will then automatically scan the receipt to determine what items are eligible and register those items for the school.

At the moment, since physical box tops are still around, those items have the opportunity to count as double if they are registered through the app by scanning your receipts as well as by sending in the physical box tops!
